What is the Hazard Mitigation Plan?

The City of Houston's Office of Emergency Management is updating Houston's Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP). The Plan guides actions the City will take to reduce risk and impacts from disasters over the next five years and beyond. The Hazard Mitigation Plan also allows Houston to receive funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to reduce our community's vulnerability to disasters.

The City's goal is to prevent damage before it occurs, save lives, protect property, and limit the cost of recovery throughout Houston. The Hazard Mitigation Plan is important for our City to be safe and resilient.




